## What is skilled care?

Individuals seeking skilled care need post-acute care, and are often shorter-term stays. Those in skilled care often need physicianprescribed physical, speech and/or occupational therapy to recover from significant surgery, or a stroke, respiratory, heart or kidney issues, and need additional care after being discharged from a hospital. Individuals also may require wound care, injection therapies, monitoring of vital signs and medical equipment that can't be found in a home.

#### What is long-term care?

When care needs become too much to go home, our long-term care provides a safe environment. Residents in long-term care need daily help with toileting, dressing, bathing, eating and have ambulatory and other health issues that require constant care and supervision.

#### What is respite care?

If an individual needs a brief recovery period following an illness, accident, surgery or other medical problem, Virginia Health Services offers respite – or short-term nursing – care. We also offer respite care for individuals whose families need additional care giving support during emergencies or vacations.
